



## TEEN LEADERSHIP TEAM MEMBER RESPONSIBILITIES

The St. Andrew high school youth group (Credo) is supported by a team of teens that are participating members of the youth group. Teen Leadership Team (TLT) members are selected on several factors including participation in the group and in the parish, personal responsibility and maturity, ability to work with peers, being a good role model in the parish and community, and being faithful Catholics.

TLT members are asked to share in the following responsibilities:

### **THE PILLARS OF THE CREDO TEEN LEADERSHIP TEAM**

1. Be faithful to Catholic teaching and to the Magisterium of the Church.
2. Attend Mass regularly and participate in the Sacraments.
3. Support the vision of the St. Andrew faith formation programs and staff.
4. Provide a welcoming atmosphere for all youth who attend events.
5. Promote our programs and parish to friends at school and at work.
6. Help plan and execute a minimum of one youth event each month and assist with any duties related to that event (meetings, mailings, advertising, preparing materials, decorating, presenting, etc.)
7. Aide in the set-up, hosting, fellowship, and clean-up of events.
8. Participate in at least one Thursday Youth Holy Hour per month. If you are unable to make your evening, you are responsible for informing your team leader and finding a sub.
9. Pray regularly for the youth program at St. Andrew.
10. Participate in the annual Passion Play and any/all other Credo sponsored events.
11. Have the courage to live your faith out loud without fear of what others will think or say or do.
12. Speak positively of your fellow team members, all Credo participants, adult CORE members, St. Andrew the Apostle parish staff, and all those affiliated with the Catholic Church.
13. Uphold a moral character, in words and actions, worthy of being a leader in this Catholic youth program both here AND outside the church grounds.
14. Have an open heart and mind for activities, suggestions and events. Be willing to give all opportunities and ideas a fair chance.
15. Be willing to attend additional catechetical or leadership training, local or national conferences, and/or in-house training sessions as recommended by the parish staff.

You, are a gift from God, and a gift to our program and this ministry. Remember that in this ministry, we are called to be **servants** of the group and those who attend. You are the role models, the examples, and often the first and LAST person they will encounter when people attend our events. Make them feel welcome, treat them with warmth and sincerity and be attentive to their needs. Christ told us that, *"If anyone wants to be first, he must be the very last, and the servant of all."* (Mark 9:35). Make God bless you!
